



## spring start-up checklist

The following are general guidelines. Check your owner's manual for manufacturer's recommendations or procedures specific to your boat.

### FUEL SYSTEM

- Inspect hoses, connections and tank surfaces for leaks or damage
- Replace components as needed
- Verify all fittings and clamps are properly secured
- Ensure the engine, exhaust, and ventilation systems are functioning properly

### BELTS, CABLES & HOSES

- Check for cracks and brittle areas
- Ensure belts fit tightly and are not worn
- Inspect the outer jacket of control cables for cracks or swells, which may indicate a problem

### ELECTRICAL SYSTEM

- Inspect all electrical connections for cleanliness and tightness; corrosion may indicate an unsafe condition
- Remove terminals and clean with a wire bush; clean cable ends
- Change battery and ensure it can hold a charge
- Electrical systems should be inspected by a qualified technician regularly

### FLUID LEVELS

- Check engine oil, power steering, power trim reservoirs and coolant levels
- Change engine oil, oil filter and drive lubricants if these tasks were not done prior to winterizing



### **PROPELLERS & HULLS**

- Inspect propellers for dings, pitting, cracks and distortion
- Make sure propeller is secured properly; replace bearings if needed
- Check hull for blisters, distortions and cracks
- Clean the hull, deck and topsides
- Ensure the drain plug is securely in place prior to every launch

### SAFETY GEAR

- Inspect life jackets to ensure they are in good condition; make sure there is one for each potential passenger
- Check that fire extinguishers are fully charged, properly stowed and are the correct class for your vessel
- Take advantage of any safety inspections offered by the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), USCG Auxiliary or U.S. Power Squadron



### pre-departure checklist

### PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICES (PFDS)

- Have onboard one PFD per passenger, minimum of two
- Have onboard a throwable device (for vessels larger than 16 ft.)
- Discuss proper use/location of PFDs

### SOUND PRODUCING DEVICES

- Have onboard a horn that can emit a four-second blast audible for 1/2 mile
- Bring a spare can of air or an alternate device
- Attach a whistle to each PFD

### LIGHTS & SHAPES

- Test navigation lights
- Check instrument lights
- Be sure to use day-shapes (mast-head signals) if your boating activites require day-shapes
- Bring a flashlight and spare batteries

#### DISTRESS SIGNALS

- Ensure that flares, day signals, etc., are accessible and stored in a dry location
- Discuss location, proper use and safety rules

#### **TOOLS & SPARES**

- Be sure to have a basic toolbox with boat-appropriate tools
- Be sure to bring a spare fuel filter, light bulbs, head parts, through-hull plugs, etc.

### FUEL & OIL

- Check fuel levels
- Check the engine oil and coolant levels

### FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

- Make sure you have a fully charged, accessible fire extinguisher (s) as specified in Coast Guard rules
- Ensure mounts are secure and functional
- Discuss location with passengers and crew

### VENTILATION

- On any powered vessel or vessels using LPG, check that interior spaces are well ventilated
- If you smell fuel before ventilating, run blowers for several minutes and re-check before starting
- If odors persist, shut down the engine and look for the source of the leak

#### BILGES

- Ensure bilges are reasonably dry and pumps are not running excessively
- Clean any spilled oil or waste in bilges to prevent overboard discharge

### WEATHER FORECAST

- Check the weather forecast before departure
- Have portable radio onboard for weather updates

### BATTERY CARE

- For dual charging systems, check that the selector switch is in the proper position
- Ensure power is on to the entire vessel.
- Bring spare batteries for handheld radio, flashlight, portable navigational aid, etc.
- Ensure rechargeable batteries are charged

### DOCKING & ANCHORING TIPS


- Be sure to have one anchor set up and bent-on the anchor line
- Bring two or three extra dock lines
- Visually inspect lines for chafe or wear
- Bring fenders (minimum 2) for docking or towing

#### RULES & DOCUMENTATION

- Bring ship's papers, radio license, fishing permit, etc.
- Bring chart(s) for the area you intend to cruise


